PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED

The City of Palm Bay invites you to a public hearing for Malabar Road Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study (FPID 437210-1) in City of Palm Bay, on **Thursday, November 14, 2024**. The purpose of this study is to meet future traffic demand and evaluate the four lane widening throughout the study limits. The study also evaluated safety and bicycle and pedestrian enhancements along the corridor. The study's limits are from the St. Johns Heritage Parkway in Brevard County to Minton Road in the City of Palm Bay, a distance of approximately four miles.

This hearing is being conducted to present the preferred alternative and all analysis to date, as well as to give interested persons an opportunity to express their views concerning the location, conceptual design, and social, economic, and environmental effects of the proposed improvements. The information presented during either format will be the same and all attendees will have the opportunity to comment.

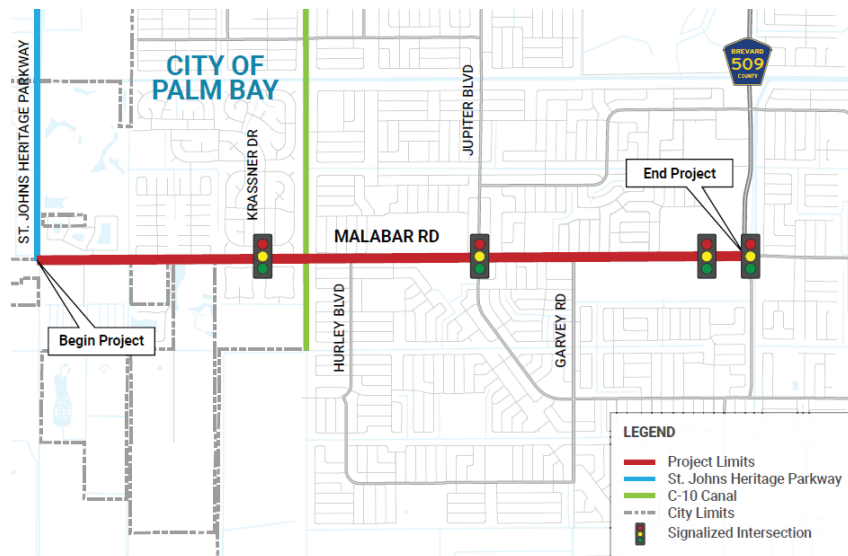

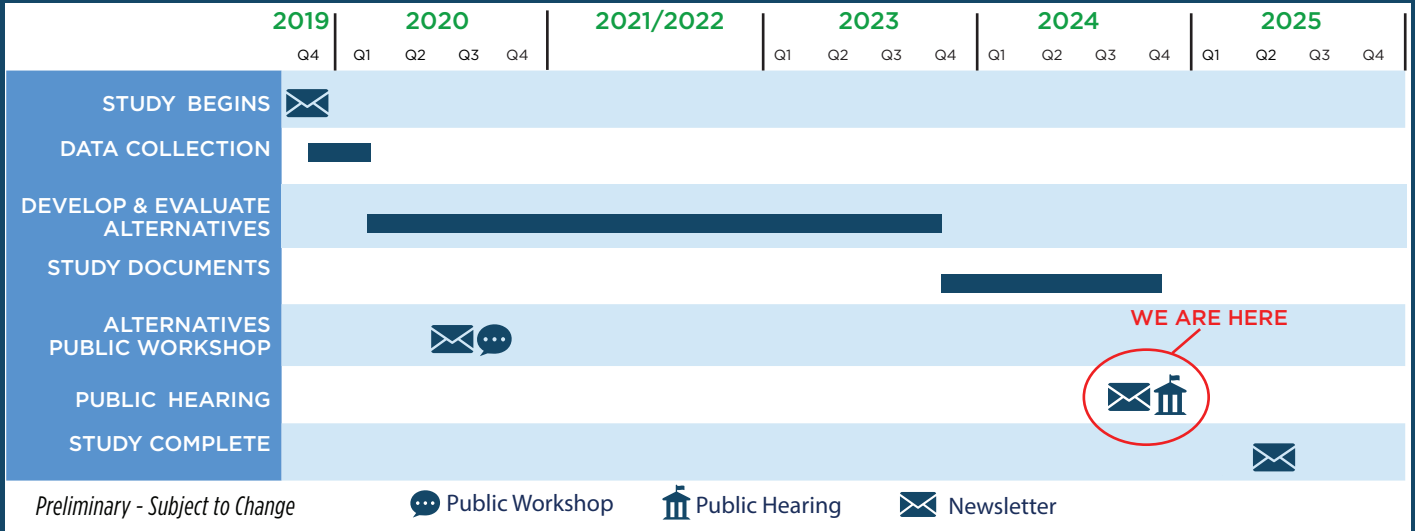

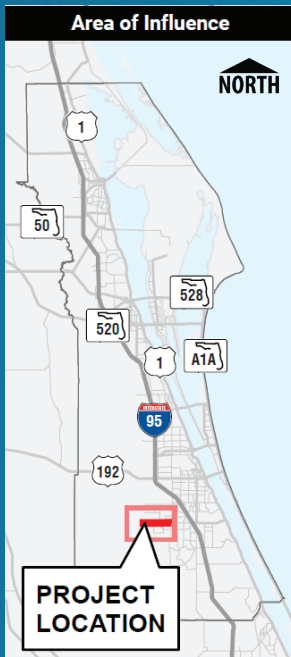
