



II. PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Malabar Road Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study will evaluate the need to widen Malabar Road from St. Johns Heritage Parkway to Minton Road, in Brevard County (**Figure 1**). The total project length is four miles. Within the study limits, Malabar Road is currently a two-lane roadway within the City of Palm Bay. The purpose of the project is to accommodate future travel demand and improve safety. This project is identified in the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization's (TPO) 2018/19 to 2022/23 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP), and 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP).

During the PD&E Study, the project team will evaluate potential impacts to the natural, social, cultural, and physical environment to determine which of the proposed alternatives meet the project need. All viable alternatives and alignments, including the no-build alternative, will remain an option throughout the PD&E Study. Opportunities for public input will occur throughout the PD&E Study phase.

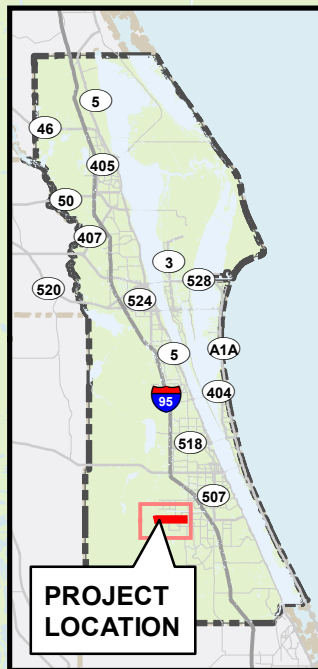
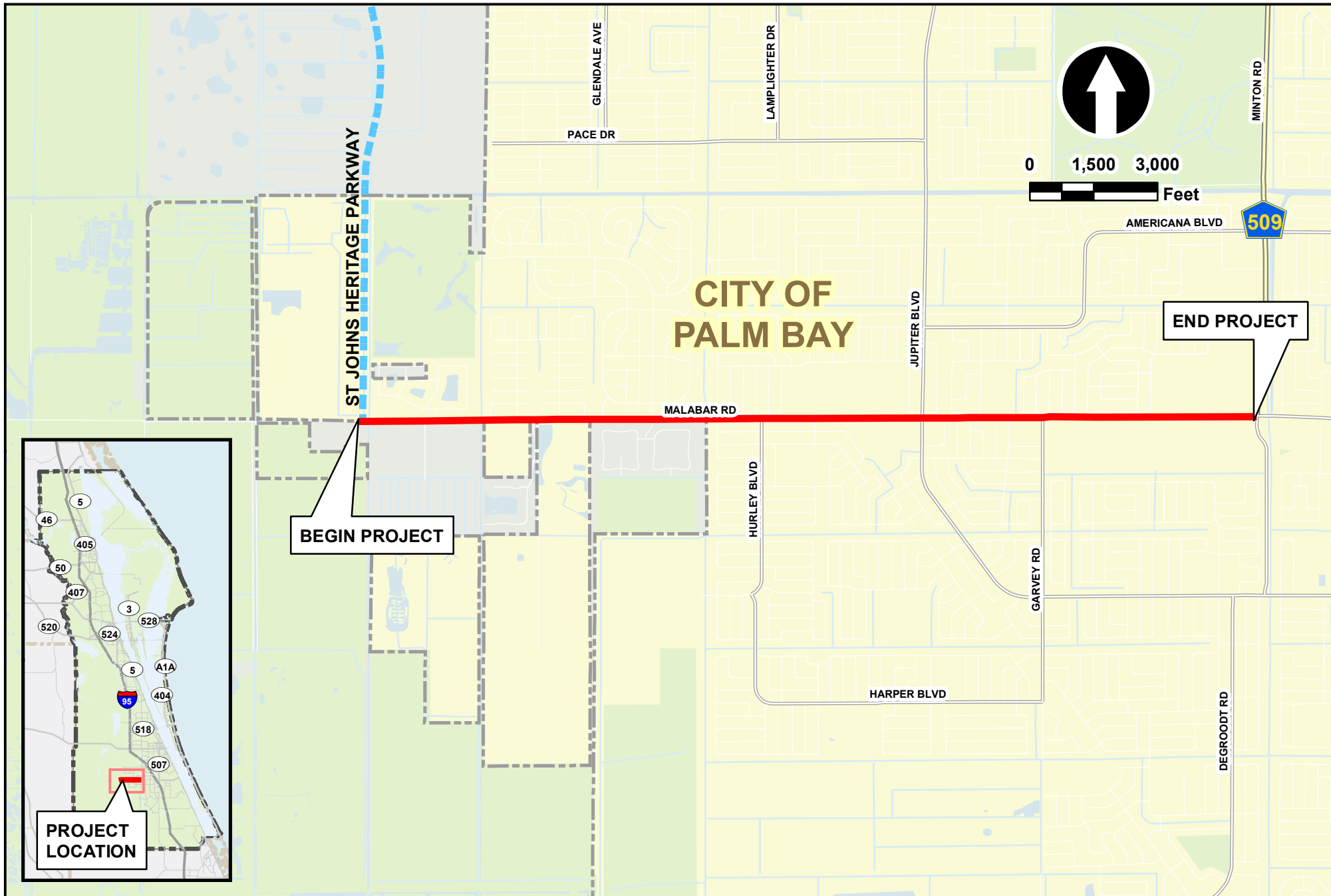
The PD&E Study has the following project objectives:

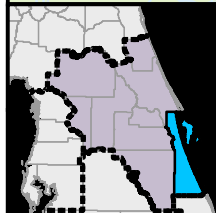

VI. IDENTIFICATION OF AFFECTED COMMUNITIES AND STAKEHOLDERS

This project traverses through the City of Palm Bay in Brevard County. A map of the community in relation to the project limits is provided on page 2 of this PIP. The demographics of the study area were obtained through the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Environmental Justice Screening Tool, using American Community Survey (ACS) 2013-2017 Census Data.

Based on the demographics of the study area, there are higher than average minority and low-income populations in the area. Therefore, the project team will strive to hold all public meetings at a location accessible by transit. The percent of the total population within the study area who reported that they speak English "not well" or "not at all" is approximately 2%. This includes people who speak Spanish, Indo-European languages, Asian and Pacific Island languages, and "Other" languages. Based on an evaluation of the four LEP factors outlined in Chapter 11 of the PD&E Manual, we have determined that bilingual translation and distribution of materials within the project vicinity will not required for public outreach materials, the project website, and public meetings.

VII. OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

The following techniques will be used to notify the public of the proposed transportation improvement and to solicit public input into the project development process.

Letters/Newsletters:

Invitational and informational newsletters will be distributed to elected and appointed officials, property owners/tenants, business owners/operators, and interested parties, throughout the PD&E Study.

Public Notices/Display Ads:

Public advertisement will consist of a display advertisement published in the area newspaper with the largest circulation, *Florida Today*, once prior to the public information meeting and twice (at least 15 days and no more than 30 days) prior to the public hearing. Additionally, announcements of the public information meeting and the public hearing will be published in the *Florida Administrative Register* at least seven days prior to each meeting and will be posted on the FDOT Public Notices website.

News/press releases will be reviewed by the City of Palm Bay prior to distribution.

Project Website:

A webpage for the project will be hosted on the City of Palm Bay website at palmbayflorida.org. It will provide information on the project location, overview, schedule, meetings, documents, and contact information. The website address will be included in all public involvement materials. Project news and notification of upcoming meetings will also be included on the City's Public Notices webpage through the City's Public Relations Department.

Public Announcements:

In order to distribute information to a broader segment of the community, fliers will be made available to organizations such as neighborhood/civic groups, FDOT, and Brevard County to publish in existing newsletters and websites. Any such correspondence will be coordinated through the City of Palm Bay.

Direct Mail List for Public Meetings:

The following will be contacted by direct mail in order to obtain input throughout the project development process and/or in order to provide project information:

- Those whose property lies, in whole or part, within at least 300 feet on either side of each project alternative (Section 339.155 FS), as well as other local citizens who may be impacted by the construction of this project. This portion of the mailing list will be based on the Brevard County Property Appraiser's tax rolls.
- Local elected and appointed public officials or individuals who request to be placed on the mailing list for this project.
- Public and private groups, organizations, agencies, or businesses that request to be placed on the mailing list for this project.

Presentations to Local Officials:

Presentations may be given to local officials and agencies, including the City of Palm Bay Council, Brevard County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC), and Space Coast TPO, prior to the public information meeting to apprise local officials of the project status,

specific location and design concepts, and to receive their comments. A schedule of the 2020 agency meetings is provided in Appendix B.

Public Information Meeting:

One public information meeting will be conducted to present the project and corridor alternatives being considered as well as to obtain comments from the general public. The meeting will be informal. The City of Palm Bay City Hall could be used for the public information meeting.

Public Hearing:

A public hearing will be held toward the end of the project, in accordance with Federal Regulations and State Law, to allow stakeholders a final opportunity to express their views concerning the location, conceptual design, and social, economic and environmental effects of the proposed improvements. The City of Palm Bay City Hall could be used for the public hearing.

Informal Meetings:

In addition to the scheduled public meetings, there will be approximately 20 additional meetings with the public, elected and appointed officials, public agencies, or civic groups as requested. The purpose of these meetings will be to apprise the attendees of the project status and specific location and design concepts as well as to receive input. Additional meetings may be added on an as needed basis.

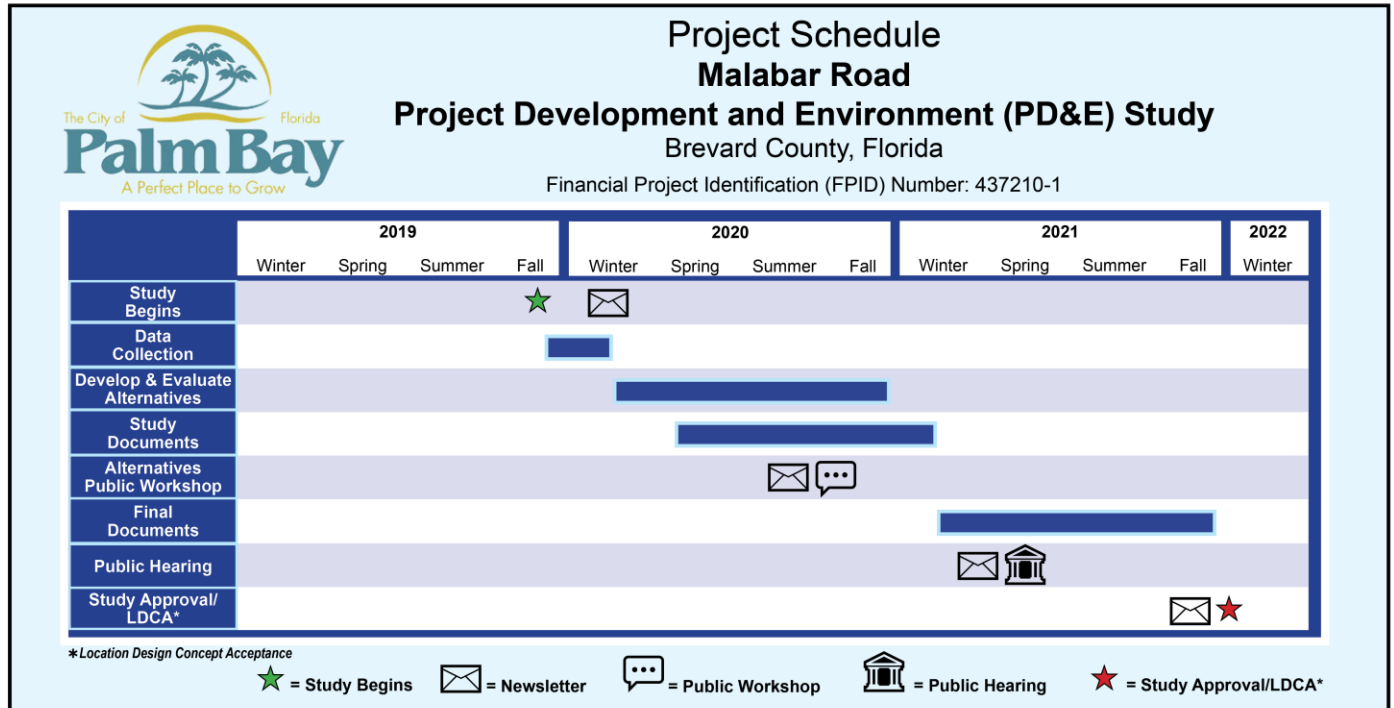
Title VI and Related Statutes:
